The Board has met and the budget for this current fiscal year is set. Our budget for 2013-2014 is just over \$48,000.00. This seems like an enormous amount of money for funding our programs; but be assured that it ALL goes to the children we serve! Our major expenditures annually are Angels' Closet, Layettes, and preparation costs for the Red Wagon Fare. This past summer we have begun a new project, "My Stuff Bags" for children who with their mothers, must flee abusive situations, often with only the clothes on their backs. It is sad that these situations continue in our society. Diane George has graciously agreed to chair this committee and we thank her for her time and efforts.

Audrey Friel and Pat Schimmel have been working with Diane George and Joanne Herrmann to keep the layette packing complete and ready for delivery. Volunteers are always needed for layette packing, packing of the "My Stuff Bags" and Angels' Closet.

My Stuff BagsFrom Diane George

The "**My Stuff Bags**" project is a very big success and very much appreciated. Kathi Welsh, who I contact at the shelter when making a delivery, said the children are so excited to get their very own drawstring-type bag. Each bag for the children includes a pair of pajamas, 2 pair of underwear, 2 pairs of socks, shorts/tee shirt or sweatsuit, depending on season. The personal bag contains toothbrush, toothpaste, comb/brush, soap, shampoo, Kleenex— and for the older children, deodorant. A book is also included according to age. Our last delivery was in July. I have been busy doing inventory and putting all items in containers according to size and gender. Inventory is in good shape right now. We should have enough items for at least 50 bags in a size from 12 months to 16 years. I was able to put the children's personal items in zip lock bags to make it easier for packing.

Kathi also indicated that the children could use school supplies. Items were donated and 10 children going to kindergarten received school supplies. Ten boys and 10 girls going to either elementary, middle or high school were given supplies. Each child received a hard cover notebook, ledger divider, ream of lined paper, school calendar, composition book, ruler, a pencil pouch with two pencils, one pen, eraser, pencil sharpener, and a box of colored pencils. When I delivered these items, Kathi was so excited and she related how much the children could use the supplies. This project will not be done on a regular basis. If enough items are donated I will do another packing, but this is not a priority. The **My Stuff Bags** will always be our number one project. One thing has changed—the items for the bags will be stored and packed at the St. Edward Social Hall in Blawnox. Father Joe Keenan was kind to give us permission to use the hall and a storage area. This will make storing and packing so much easier. I will send out an email when a packing will take place. The Women's Shelter, in 2012, served 230 women and 198 children in the residential program. The average stay is 45 days, serving children 12 months to 17 years.

I truly enjoy doing this project and hope I can live up to the amazing work the Christ Child Society continues to do.

Layette Report From Audrey Friel and Pat Schimmel

We want to send a special thanks to Doris Delserone and Phyllis Dombrowski for the splendid work they have done organizing the Layette program in the past. They left everything in good order for Audrey and I to just pick up where they left off. Also, special thanks to Joanne Hermann for continuing to get the diapers and wipes for us, to Dianne George for continuing to order the rest of the items in bulk and to Marian Flowers and Mary Ann Gonot for delivering the packages. We pack 50 layettes at a time with bottles, bibs, wipes, diapers, body suits, sleepers, gowns, receiving blankets, and beautiful crocheted or knitted blankets provided by friends of Diane Reich and Kathy Fitzgibbon. We also enclose a "Shaken Baby Syndrome" pamphlet, information about the Christ Child Society and a baby book, if we have them. Donations of baby books are greatly appreciated.

There will be a packing in September as soon as the latest order comes in. If you have already signed up wanting to be notified of the date, we will contact you be email or phone. The National Christ Child Society will hold its biennial Conference in Bethesda, MD at the Doubletree hotel, Friday, September 20, 2013 and Saturday, September 21, 2013. The topic for the Conference is **"Facing Challenges Together"**. Leadership issues will be an important part of the discussion. Ellen O'Brien will be attending as an NCCS Board Member. Planning is in full gear for the biennial NCCS Convention, which is to be held in Phoenix AZ, September 2014. Pittsburgh has sent representatives to the prior two Conventions (2012 in Detroit MI, and 2010 in Cleveland OH). We are a relatively small chapter (not the smallest!), and it is to our advantage to continue to be connected to National, and have our voice heard. Smaller chapters have challenges that are different from the larger chapters, but we are all part of this wonderful charitable work that has been done for more than 125 years.
