




MISSION STATEMENT

The 42nd Biennial Convention of the National Christ Child Society will be held September 18, 2014 through September 20, 2014 at the Firesky Resort in Phoenix Arizona. I will be attending as a National Board member. I also hope to gather materials that our chapter can use for improving and implementing our programs and mission.

The theme of the Convention is **Together in Mission: Share, Support, Serve.** One aspect of this convention is an expansion of the number of mini seminars that will be offered. Topics that these seminars will cover include: Strategic Planning, Board orientation, Social Media (using this tool wisely), Working With and Evaluating partners, Grant Writing Success Stories, 10 Fundraising ideas, Program and Membership Discussion Panel, and Communication Skills for Women. This Convention marks the end of my third two year term on the National Board.
