Marian Flowers delivered 12 Layettes to PCUC, Dottie Talarico delivered 4 Layettes to Jeremiah's Place in Homewood and Charlotte Collins delivered 20 Layettes to Genesis of Pittsburgh. Genesis of Pittsburgh is another organization in which CCS is now servicing. Genesis of Pittsburg helps young women facing unplanned pregnancy with education, housing, counseling and supplies for their newborn.

We are looking for anyone who would like to help with knitting blankets for our Layette Bags. Right now we have 2 ladies in retirement communities who help, but we could always use more knitters. If you know of anyone, please contact Charlotte Collins.

MY STUFF BAGS

In May we delivered 20 My Stuff Bags to Jeremiah's Place which is housed in Larimer's Kingsley Center in Homewood. Jeremiah's Place is a crisis nursery that provides free childcare and temporary housing to children whose families may be facing an emergency situation. The parents are then connected to social services to direct them to resources to help them to overcome their challenging situations. Jeremiah's Place cares for children from the age of infancy to about 6 years of age. We also recently delivered 20 My Stuff Bags to Genesis of Pittsburgh at their Learning Center location in Bellevue. The Genesis Center offers programs and services to pregnant women and their families when they are facing challenging situations. The center offers parenting classes, pregnancy testing, and they distribute baby equipment and clothing for infants and younger siblings. They also offer a residence where mothers who are experiencing a crisis can stay during their pregnancy.

We will be scheduling a My Stuff Bag packing in the early Fall. More information and details to follow.




