FROM THE NATIONAL CHRIST CHILD SOCIETY

The **2018 NCCS Convention, "Sustaining our Mission",** will be held in Milwaukee, WI, September 27th -September 29th, at the beautiful Pfister Hotel. The event will begin on Thursday morning with an optional Milwaukee sightseeing tour. Conference 2017's optional excursions were sold out and proved to us how much chapter members enjoyed getting to know each other in a relaxed, social atmosphere!

Two seminars will be offered on Thursday afternoon, both with a social media theme in mind. We will cover many Communications strategies including what makes for a great photo, how to use photos to tell your story, best ways to share photos, legal requirements for posting the pictures we take, and more.

Our Keynote speaker on Friday morning is Dr. Matthew D. Deevers, Senior Research Associate with the Summit Educational Initiative in Akron, OH. He will address sowing and nurturing the seeds of success in the children we serve. Attendees will leave the session with practical ideas to maintain passion, work with a purpose and develop relationships and programs that will persist for years to come. Since program development will be the theme for the day, a seminar on program development will follow and present the concept of working under a universal framework of helping children become the best they can be, finding a need and deciding how to fill it, and finding and working with partners. A Program Workshop with best practice chapter presenters will also be offered.

And new this year, we will offer a Q&A session on Friday afternoon with the NCCS Board and Staff to take any questions or concerns chapter attendees may have on our reports and budget which will be presented in the afternoon.

Saturday's seminars will cover the frequently requested topics of fundraising and membership. Our day will conclude with Mass at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist where our new NCCS Board will be installed followed by dinner and awards at the renowned Wisconsin Club.
