NATIONAL NEWS ~ GETTING NOTICED

In recent months, several of your fellow chapters have received great coverage from local news sources or recognition through their partner agencies. The National Board has spent much of its recent efforts developing resources for you to use to promote your chapters' good works in your communities. Many useful references can be found on the Marketing & Communications page of the NCCS website under the Member Resources tab to help you with your PR efforts!

Here are just a few examples of great PR. The opening of the Christ Child Society of South Bend, Indiana's Clothing Center which was recently highlighted during the "Moms First" Segment on their local TV station. The Second Saturday Program of the Milwaukee, Wisconsin chapter was featured on a local podcast called EIG Community Connection and congratulations goes out to our chapters in Central Illinois and Quad Cities for their recognition in the Catholic Post!

The Women's Care Center recently recognized the Christ Child Society of Columbus, Ohio, Duluth, Minnesota and Fort Wayne, Indiana for their service to babies and their families. Expectant parents earn shopping coupons for new baby essentials by attending child care classes offered at the Women's Care Center. These coupons are spent at Crib Club "boutiques" supplied and staffed by Christ Child members.

And CCS of Baltimore, Maryland was mentioned in the Caroline Center's summer newsletter for providing books to moms and children. The Caroline Center is a nonprofit job training center for women in Baltimore City. They provide tuition-free training for Certified Nursing Assistants and Pharmacy Technicians for women in need.

How did National know that these chapters had received recognition? They posted the good news on their Facebook pages! That way we were able to "Like and Share" their news to a larger audience. These three women have given many years of work embracing the mission of Christ Child. They truly represent the best of the Society. The Red Wagon Award was given to the Fort Wayne IN chapter for their 'Reading Rangers' program promoting literacy. This award carries a \$500 prize to be used in the program.

The newly elected Board was formally introduced. Carol Pickle spoke about the next two years, encouraging the delegates to bring the ideas learned at convention to their home chapters, and find ways to use them in their programs.
