This Christmas, our My Stuff Bag committee bought Christmas gifts for 13 needy children at Conroy Education Center. We also received a large donation of toys and clothing from the giving tree participants at St. Bonaventure Church, which were included as much as possible depending on the children's wish lists. According to Mrs. Randy Green, the teacher of the class for whom we bought, the children were thrilled and she was very impressed with our generosity.

The National Christ Child Society held its National Day of Service on Saturday, October 27, 2018. Our chapter participated by providing a book to every child who came for a coat and adding a book nook, where we read to the children if they wished. I submitted a report to NCCS on our event and I was sent a wonderful letter from which I would like to share: "Congratulations on your wonderful National Day of Service Project! Your chapter did an excellent job of adding a literary element to an existing program. The "book nook" concept not only reached out to children, but also involved their parents, a key element in establishing reading habits at home. You brought in a community partner with the bookstore that not only donated books, but also sorted them for age appropriateness. Your success was summarized by the children: "Some of the kids wanted to read the books rather than try on coats!" Your creative idea impressed the judges of the National Day of Service Award committee. Although you were selected as a runner-up, the award winning Pasadena Chapter was also impressed by your program- enough so that they insisted on sharing the award money with the Pittsburgh chapter!" Our Pittsburgh chapter was given \$250 by Pasadena in recognition of our contribution to challenging poverty through reading. We are grateful to the Pasadena chapter for their generosity in sharing their prize money to help with our literacy initiative.

NATIONAL NEWS

During the NCCS Convention, Matthew Deevers, PhD delivered the keynote address "Seeds to Trees: Cultivating Persistence in Ourselves, Our Chapters and Our Programs." Just as the tiny redwood seed has the capacity to grow into the tallest of trees, Matt reminded us each person is born with the capacity to persist and thrive. A variety of life conditions determine the outcomes. Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) can disrupt the growth and development of a child with long lasting consequences.

Matt highlighted three factors that affect behaviors and commitments of humans in every level and sphere of life. He calls these factors the ABCs of Persistence.

A = ABILITY: Our drive to learn, to understand our world, and to feel competent in daily life.

B= BELONGING: Our intense need to bond with others and to feel a connection to our work.

C = CONTROL: Our demand for some degree of freedom and choice in how we do what we need to do.

Having a well-balanced measure of Ability, Belonging and Control brings strength, structure and security to our identity and to our chapters, which in turn will support our drive to persist and flourish! We invite all of our chapter members to ask this question "What can we do to make a positive difference in the lives of those we serve, in our chapter organizations and for those we work with directly as volunteers?"
